
What factors need to be taken into account when choosing MCS tools?

- 2. Limitations of the existing governance framework
- 3. Capacity limitations

Strengthening MCS through a High Seas Treaty



- **❖** Package deal:
- 1) Marine genetic resources
- 2) Area-based management tools, including marine protected areas
- 3) Environmental impact assessments
- 4) Capacity-building and transfer of technology
- >Institutional arrangements and the clearing-house mechanism
- ❖No global MCS system: cross-cutting issue
- Two-way relationship between MCS and the treaty
- States prefer discussing substantive issues first



Three potential pathways to strengthen MCS provisions

1) Consolidating and reinforcing MCS obligations and principles

➤ Cooperation and coordination, transparency and reporting

2) Developing a strong MCS role for the clearing-house mechanism

➤ Platform to share best practices, exchange data and match capacity-building needs

3) Requiring submission of a MCS strategy in ABMT proposals

>Initial indication of resources required to ensure no "paper park" management

Conclusion



- MCS as implementing tool for States to meet international obligations regarding human activities on the high seas
- Great variety of MCS tools available, but reliance on flag State responsibility, governance gaps in ABNJ and lack of capacity are main challenges
- No one-size-fits-all approach to MCS
- Cooperation and coordination is key:
 - o Chair of the FISH-i Africa Task Force: "the cheapest tool in fighting IUU fishing is the sharing of information and intelligence through cooperation among all MCS practitioners"
- 3 easy ways to strengthen MCS in the treaty: 1) reinforce MCS obligations and principles, 2) strong MCS role in clearing-house mechanism and 3) MCS strategy in ABMT proposals
