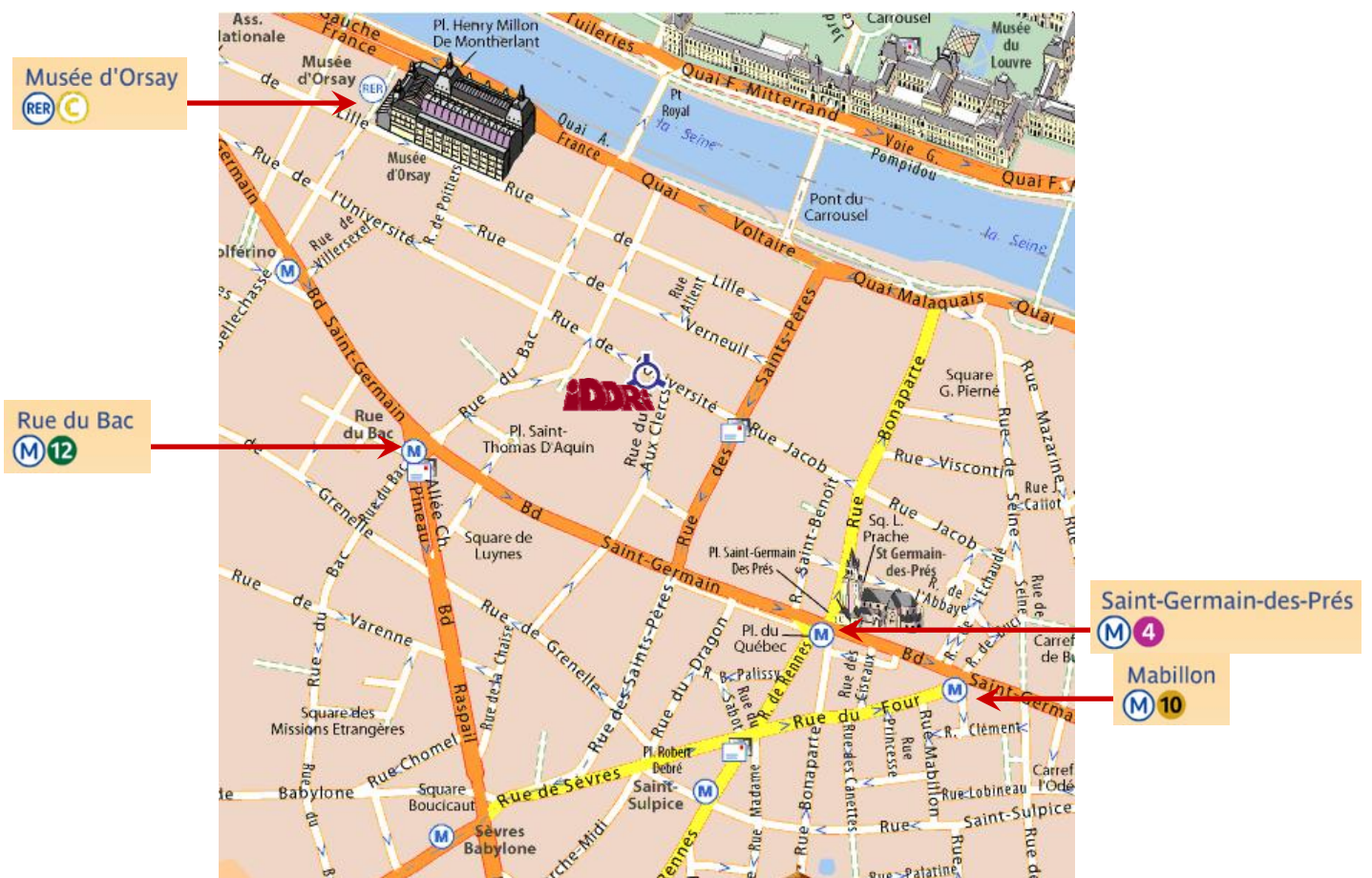


Linkage between forest-based mitigation and GHG markets

The workshop starts on the premise that the attendance has already got general information on deforestation causes and remedies in different contexts, as well as a basic understanding of emission trading schemes and other instruments for financing climate mitigation. Accordingly minimal time will be spent on sharing background material during presentations. The introductory session will only involve discussions on recent developments in order to bring the group of participants up-to-date. Beyond delivering outline information and viewpoints, most presentations are primarily aimed at framing and opening discussions – they should therefore be short and focussed (15 minutes) in order to allow for proper discussions to take place.
