

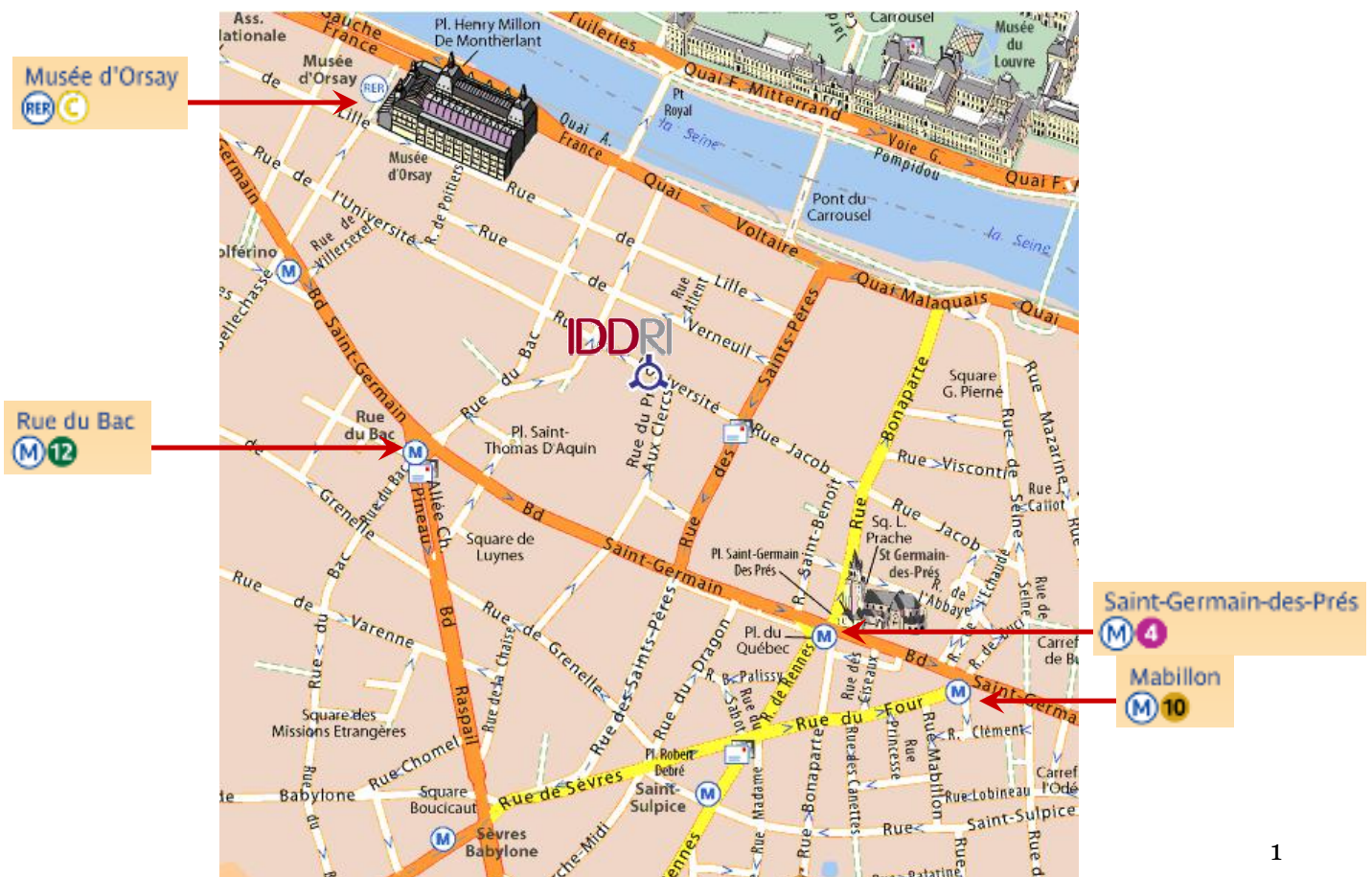
## International support for REDD strategies Options and consequences

The workshop starts on the premise that the attendance has already got general information on deforestation causes and remedies in different contexts, as well as a basic understanding of instruments of support for climate mitigation including emission trading schemes, and the overall context of international negotiations for a post-Kyoto regime.

The Thursday afternoon session will involve background presentations and discussions in order to bring the group of participants up-to-date on recent developments in the realms of policies and ideas.

The Friday session will go in depth into issues related to the architecture of a future GHG-based REDD regime, and on issues related to interim support for REDD strategies.

Beyond delivering outline information and viewpoints, most presentations are primarily aimed at framing and opening discussions – they should therefore be short and focussed in order to allow for proper discussions to take place. While intervening during discussions, participants are most welcome to use a couple of slides to support their argument as needed.
