Can one size fit all? Accommodating national circumstances in an international REDD regime

Although the international debate on reducing emission from deforestation and degradation (REDD) has experienced significant progress over the past years, several controversies remain; a key challenge being how to effectively accommodate into **one international REDD regime** the diversity of local situations regarding forests (low/high deforestation) and forest policies (sustainable forest management, conservation, afforestation/

reforestation)? How can this challenge of accommodating differing “national circumstances” be addressed until 2012 and beyond? What are necessary conditions and requirements at local and international level? To identify potential paths towards a locally sensitive, international REDD regime, IDDRI organizes a **roundtable with key negotiators and experts**; the debate will be facilitated by Ms. Laurence Tubiana, IDDRI Director.
