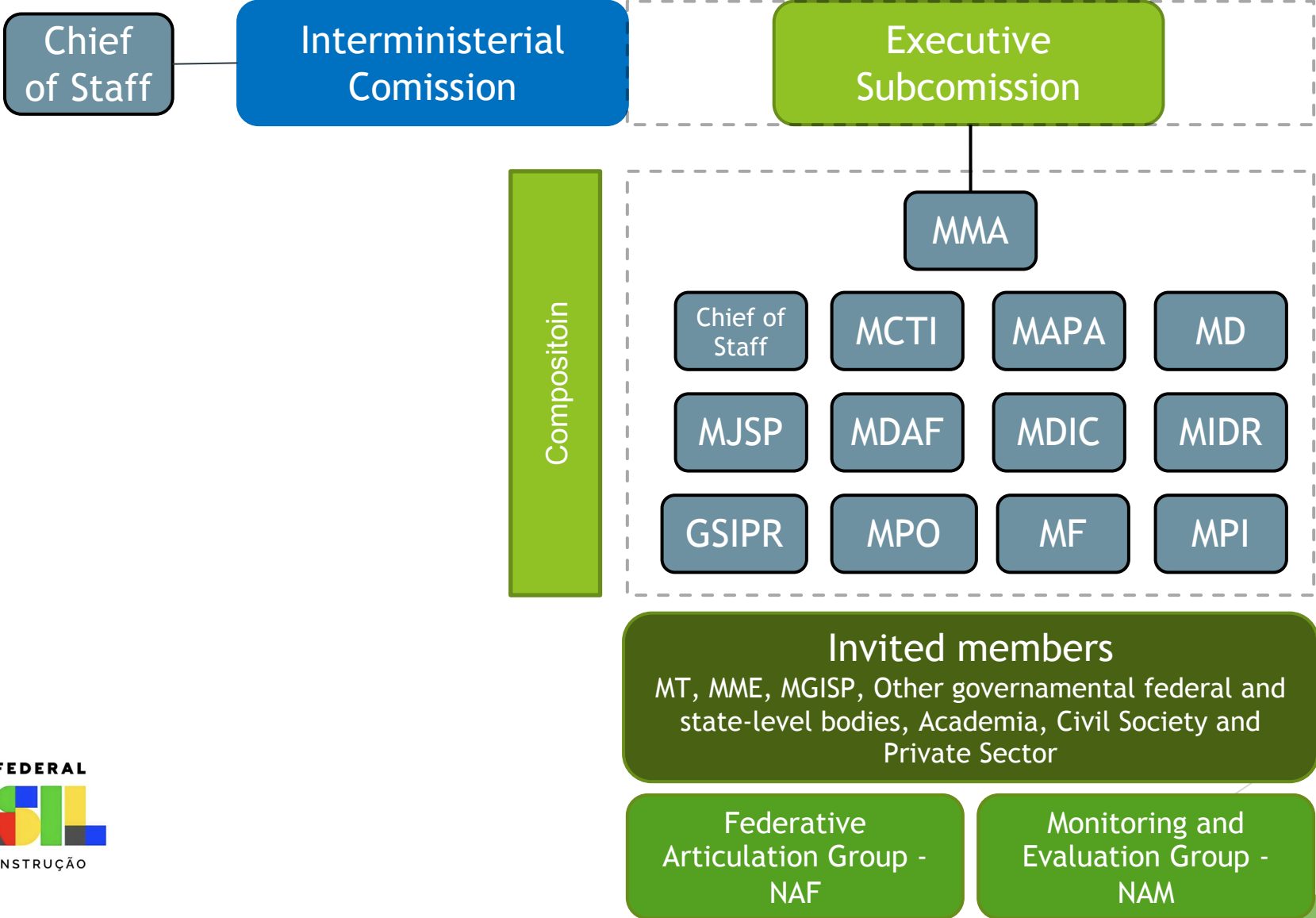

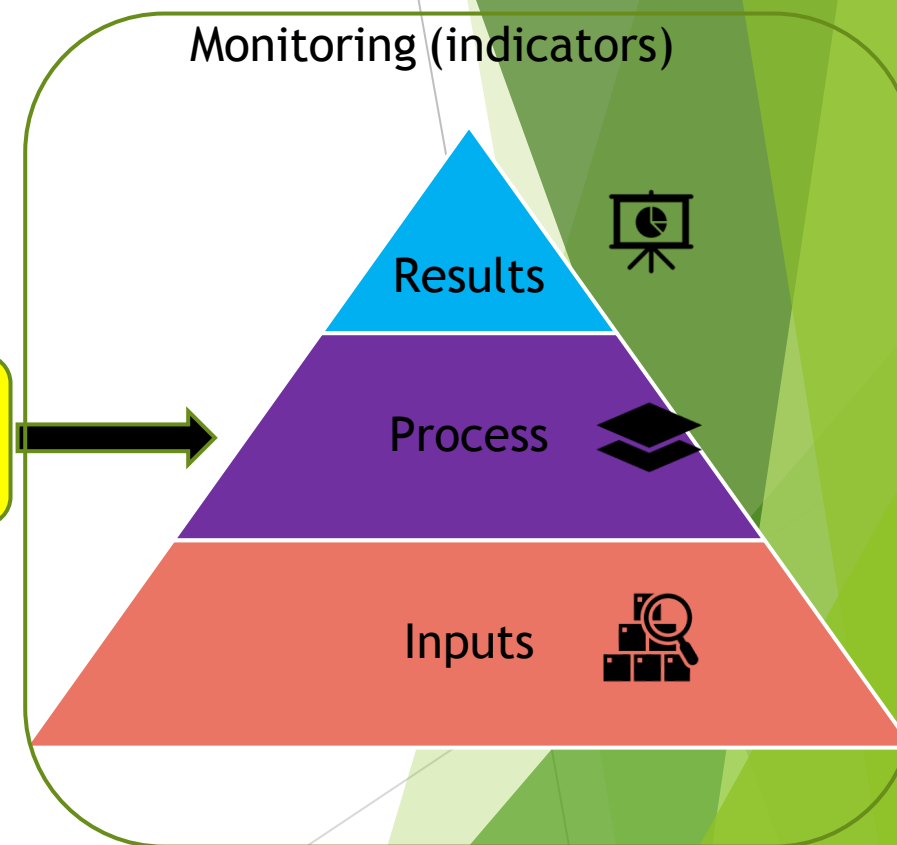
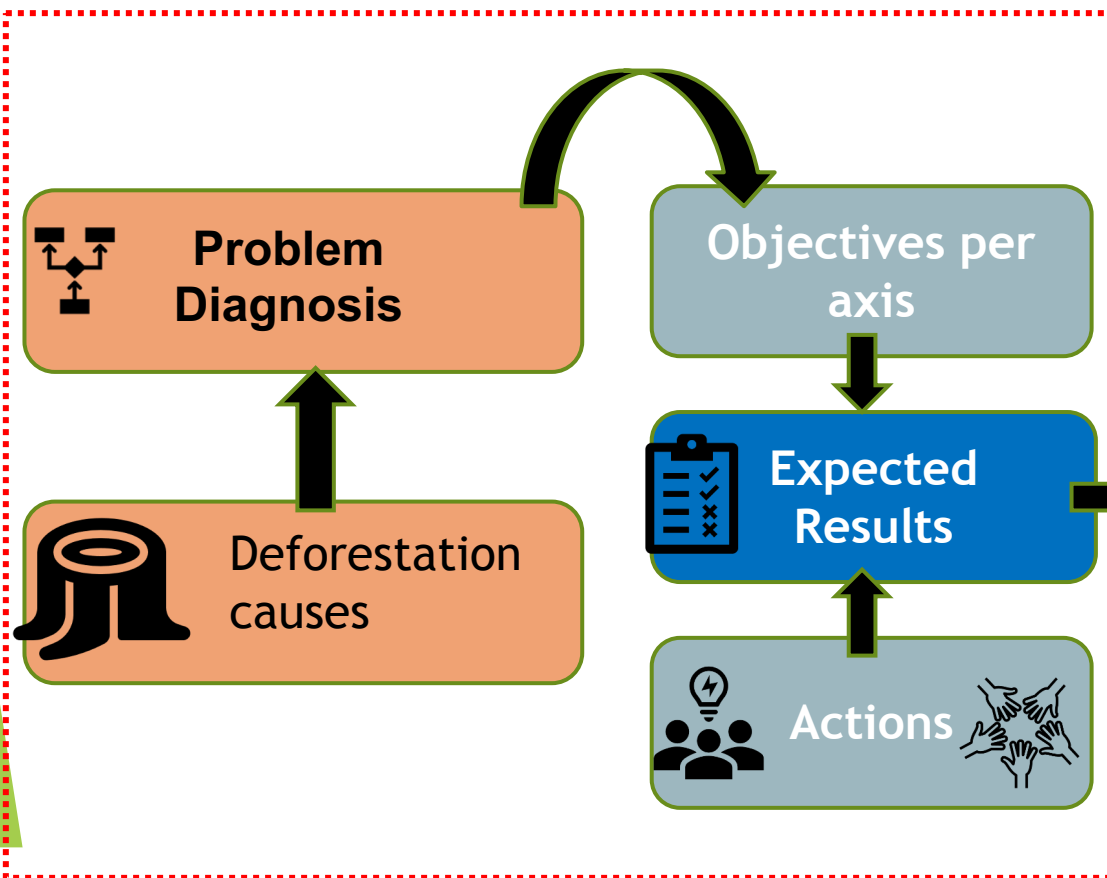

- Monthly Meetings with the secretary of environment of the states of the Amazon
- 10th Technical-Scientific Seminar on Deforestation in the Amazon
- Public consultation of preliminary version:
 - 510 contributions
 - 100s of pages of submitted documents
 - 83 individuals/organizations

Axis I. Sustainable Production Activities

Goal 1. To encourage sustainable productive activities

Goal 2. To encourage forest management and recovery of deforested areas

Goal 3. To strengthen articulation with Legal Amazon States towards sustainable productive activities

Axis II. Monitoring and Environmental Control

Goal 4. To ensure accountability for environmental crimes and administrative infractions linked to deforestation and forest degradation

Goal 5. Improve the capacity to monitor deforestation, fires, degradation and supply chains

Goal 6. To prevent and combating the occurrence of forest fires

Goal 7. To strengthen the articulation with the states of the Legal Amazon in environmental inspection actions

Goal 8. To strengthen articulation with Legal Amazon States in law enforcement actions and full data integration concerning deforestation authorizations and embargos

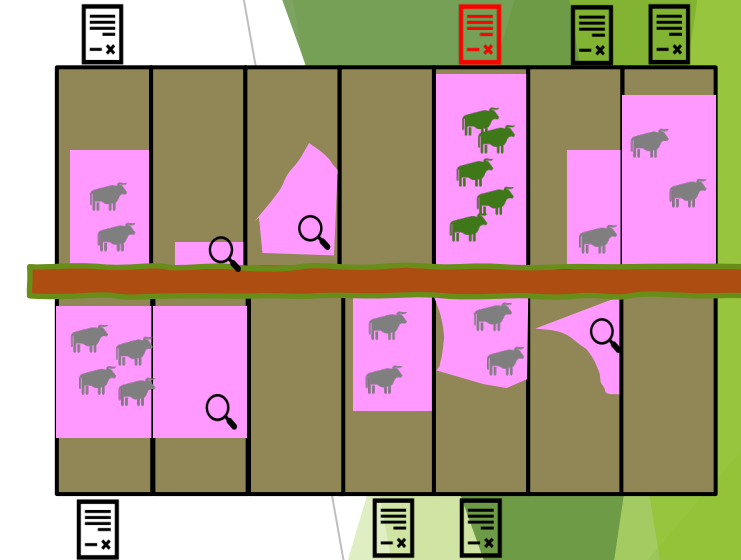

Actions already implemented

- ▶ Strengthening of law enforcement actions:
 - ▶ Establishment of new procedures for satellite-based embargoes
 - ▶ Jan-Jul of 2023 in relation to 2022
 - ▶ Fines: +173%
 - ▶ Embargoes: +123%
 - ▶ Destruction equipment: +254%
 - ▶ Seizures: +107%
- ▶ Greening Rural Credit:
 - ▶ More rigorous rules blocking loans to farms with embargoes and overlapping protected areas
 - ▶ Incentives for environmental regularization in “Plano Safra” (0.5% reduction in interest rates)

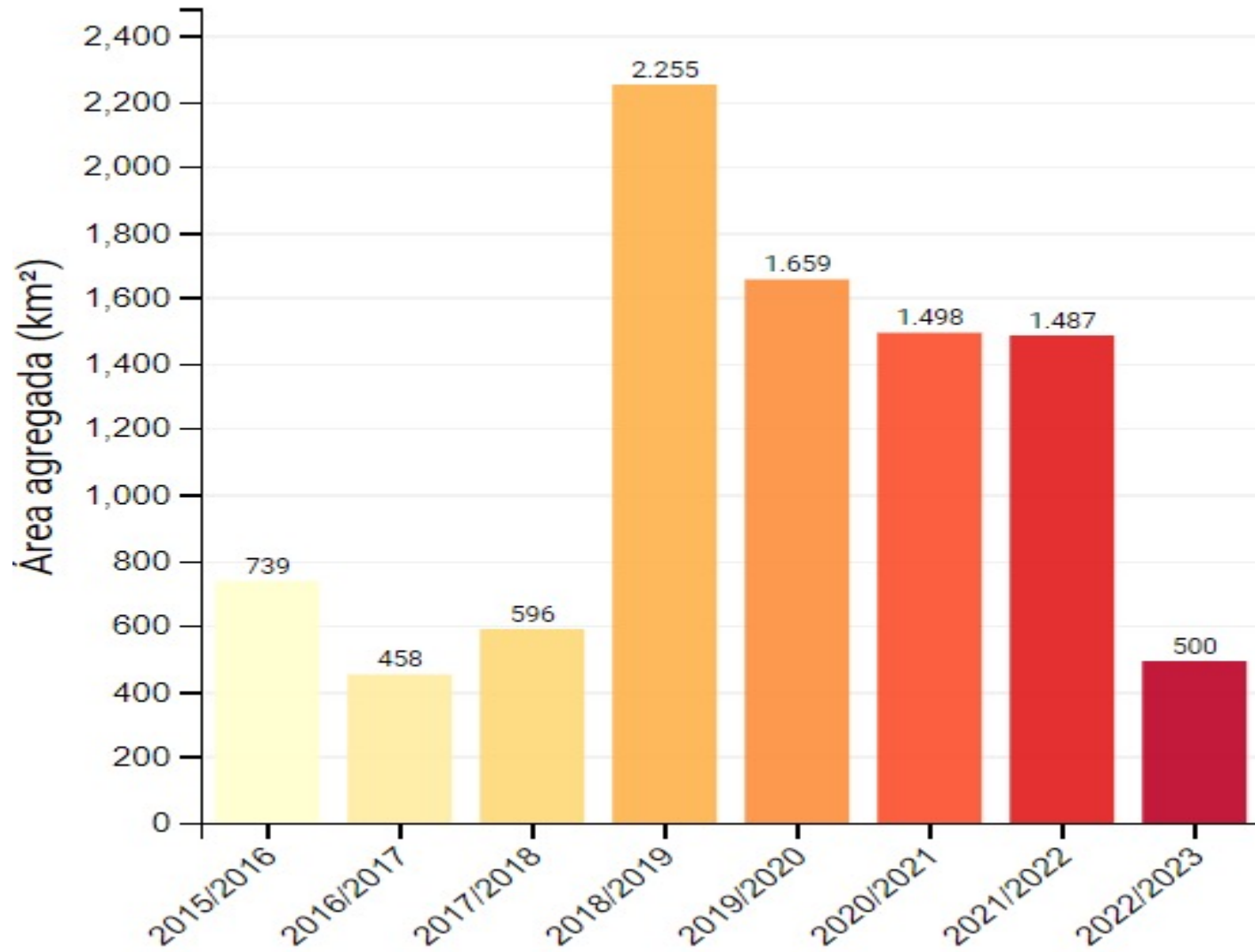


Actions already implemented

- ▶ Partnership with State-level environmental agencies:
 - ▶ Joint action with Pará to notify and potentially cancel Environmental Registries (CAR) all medium and large farms with illegal deforestation after 2018
- ▶ Implementation of Floresta+ program (Jan-July 2023):
 - ▶ “Mutirões” (joint actions) in 9 municipalities of the states of Amapá, Acre, Pará and Rondonia to assist small farmers obtaining environmental regularization (+2700 beneficiaries)
 - ▶ Payment for ecosystem services via Floresta+ to 130 beneficiaries (R\$ 800 thousands paid)



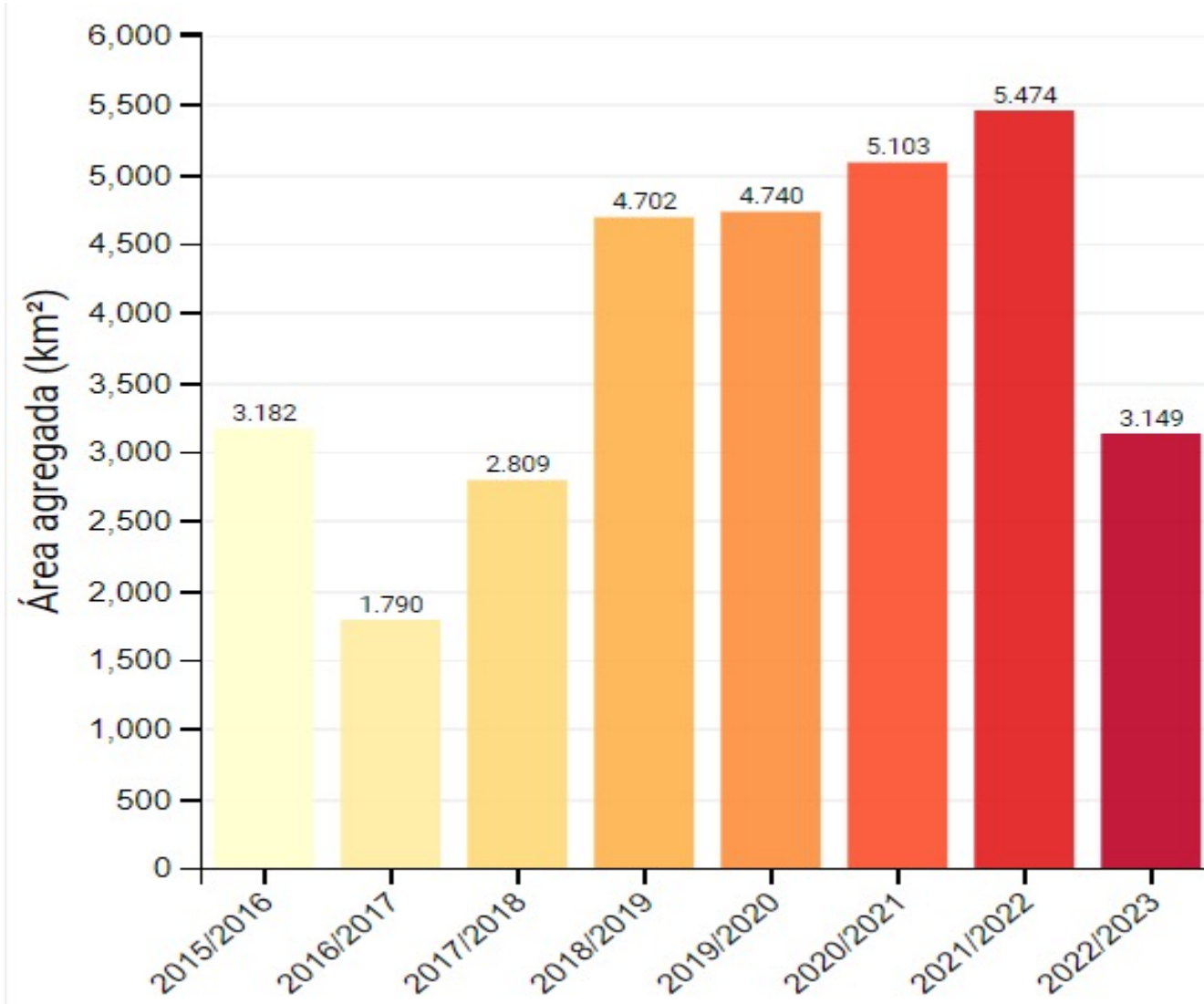
DETER Amazon July 2023

Reduction of 42,5% in 2023 in relation to 2022

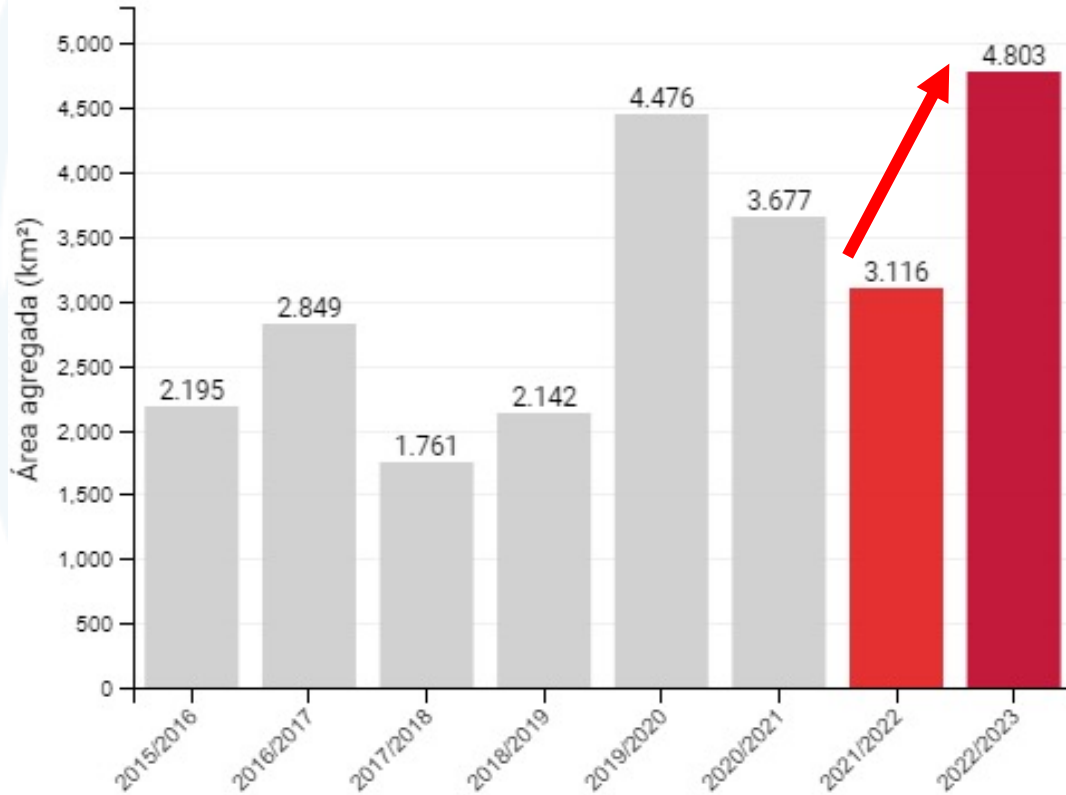
August to December 2022

Filtro: 2021/2022, 2022/2023

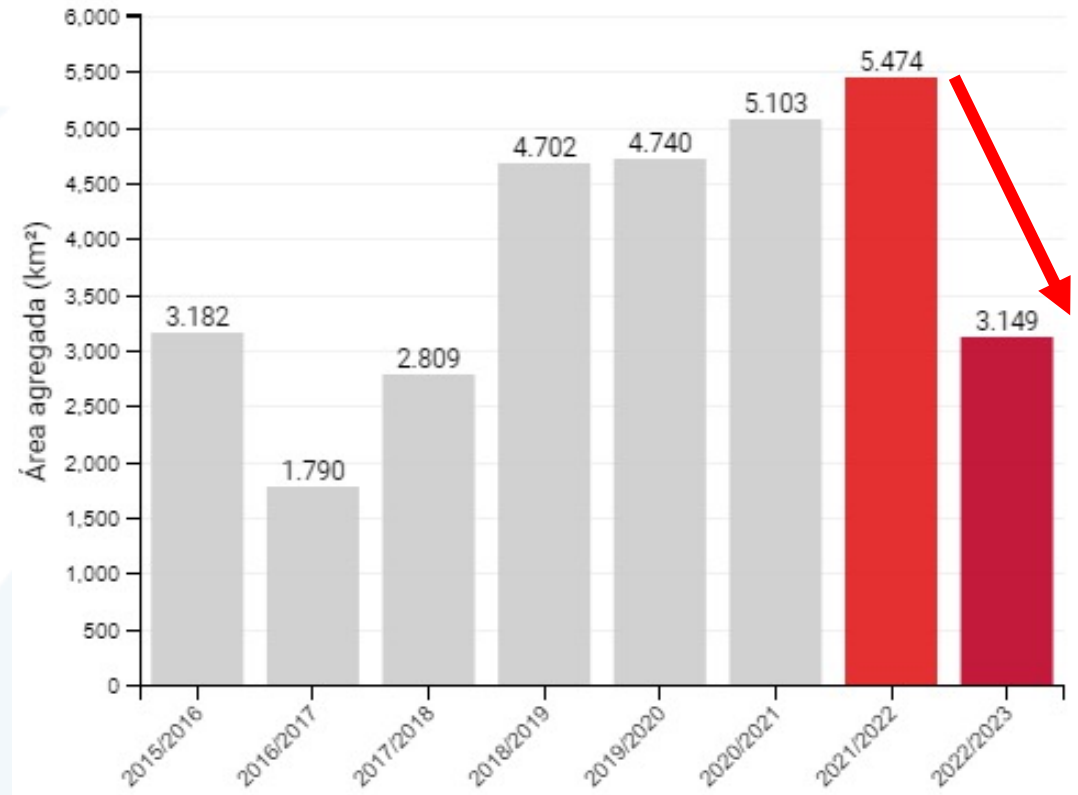

Key challenges

- ▶ Building of political consensus with states and municipalities
- ▶ Maintaining deforestation-control high in the agenda
- ▶ New financial mechanisms for private and public sectors based on deforestation-targets and policy deliverables:
 - ▶ Green bonds
 - ▶ Sustainability-linked loans
 - ▶ Blended finance embedding PSA
 - ▶ Independent audits based on universal soy and cattle traceability (i.e. based on invoices and GTA)
